

# Start Slated on Two County Flood Projects

Two measures to bring relief from flood waters in the Santa Monica and Artesia areas yesterday were announced by the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Herbert C. Legg reported the approval of a \$1,000,000 flood control project on the San Gabriel River and Coyote Creek. The river, said Legg, will get a concrete facing along the levies from Spring to 7th Sts. in the Artesia district. Coyote Creek will be widened and straightened from its mouth at the San Gabriel River to Spring St.

A low bid of \$228,975 was received from Steve Rados Inc., a construction firm, for the building of Santa Monica's Lincoln Blvd. storm drain from Pico Blvd. to the Santa Monica city limits, Legg said. The project, which will get top priority above other construction plans on Lincoln Blvd., will relieve surface flooding. The contract is to be awarded before June 2.
